

Visit Practicalities: Nottingham



Before your visit

Teacher pre-visits

It is recommended you visit the National Justice Museum before you visit with your group. We offer free visits* to teachers who are looking to visit the museum (*admits two adults or 1 adult and 1 child.) You will need to pre-book a teacher visit by calling 0115 9939811.

Supervision

Primary Schools - Admission for staff is free of charge and we require as many staff as possible to accompany the group. We need at least one adult for every seven pupils.

Secondary schools and colleges - We require at least two members of staff for every group of 30. One teacher for every 10 pupils booked will be admitted free of charge. Any teachers over the suggested quota will be charged the same price as the students. Any carers/teaching assistants who are accompanying individuals with SEN will be admitted for free.

Lunch rooms

You will be allocated one or more lunch rooms (depending on the size of your group) to store your bags and have lunch on the day. To obtain keys to the lunch room(s) we will require a £5 deposit for each lunch room on arrival which is then refunded when the keys are returned at the end of the day.

Gift shop

We have a small gift shop located next to the reception which sells a range of confectionary, souvenirs and pocket money toys. Students visiting the gift shop must be supervised at all times and 15 pupils at a time are permitted.

Cafe

Our cafe sells drinks and snacks and is open from Wednesday until Sunday. On Mondays and Tuesdays hot and cold drinks will be available from reception. Please note under 16s must be supervised and only food and drink purchased in the café can be consumed there.

Toilets

Our main public toilets are located opposite the Civil Court Room just off the reception area. Upon arrival at the museum there will be an opportunity for pupils to use the toilets before beginning their activities. Our disabled toilet is located in the corridor leading to our Crime Gallery space just off reception.

Coach parking

Unfortunately, due to our location, we are unable to offer coach or mini bus parking at the National Justice Museum. Your coach company will be able to drop off and pick up your students outside the museum but will need to find somewhere to park during the day. Mini bus parking

If you are travelling to the museum in a mini bus you will be able to drop off and pick up from directly outside the museum but there is nowhere to park. We recommend that mini buses be parked at the 'Park Centre' car park: Park Centre, Queens Road, Nottinghamshire, Nottingham NG2 3AS.

The car park is only a ten minute walk at leisure from the museum (NG1 1HN). To reserve spaces at this car park please call 0115 9866000.

Before the visit checklist

- Have you photocopied your resources to bring on the day?
- Have you allocated roles for the courtroom workshop?
- Do you have a £5 for each key to your lunch room(s)? (One £5 deposit is required for each lunch room)
- Have you split students into separate groups as per the timetable?
- Does the timetable we have proposed match up with your travel arrangements?
- Have you made us aware of any SEN pupils attending?
- Has the payment been arranged? Please note, we need to receive full payment at least 7 days before the visit

During your visit

What do I do when I arrive?

On arrival the lead teacher will need to report to reception, via the main entrance (please leave your pupils on the coach at this point). One of our facilitators will be waiting to greet you. At reception you will be required to sign a booking form and collect your lunch room keys. (Please note that in the interests of security only one key per lunch room is issued) The facilitator will then escort you and your group to your designated lunch room(s) and then deliver a brief health and safety talk before your activities begin.

What should I do if I think we might be late / early?

If you anticipate that you will arrive earlier or later than expected, we would be grateful if you could notify the museum by calling the main reception desk on 0115 9520555 extension 200.

How do we get from one activity to the next?

Your group will be assigned a facilitator who will help you navigate the site and will take you to your activities.

The museum

Due to the nature of the museum and prison, we advise students to keep their coats with them for the museum workshops during the colder months.

Conduct

The National Justice Museum is a working building and has a number of external companies residing in offices around the building. We also regularly have members of the public visiting the museum and corporate functions taking place. Therefore, we ask all groups to respect all visitors, keep noise to a minimum and do not run in the corridors.
