



Visit Practicalities:

Royal Courts of Justice, London

What do we need to do before our visit?

- Ensure each student has a copy of the student resource pack to bring on the day (copies cannot be provided on the day)
- Allocate students with an appropriate role (as detailed in the pack)
- Ensure students are familiar with the relevant case background for their visit

What do we do on arrival?

On arrival, enter through the Royal Courts of Justice main entrance. All groups will need to pass through security (the same style as in an airport). Once through security please wait in the main hall of the Royal Courts of Justice, where your facilitator will meet you. We advise all groups to arrive approximately ten minutes before your session to allow time to pass through security and use the toilets before the session begins, if required.

What do we do if we think we might arrive late / early?

If you anticipate that you will arrive earlier or later than expected, we would be grateful if you could notify us by calling the Bookings team on 0115 9939811.

Conduct at the Royal Courts of Justice

The Royal Courts of Justice are working courts and trials take place during the day. Therefore, we ask all groups to respect the building and staff, keep noise to a minimum and not to run in corridors. Please do not eat or drink in court rooms or around the building. We ask students to follow instructions and be respectful to all members of National Justice Museum Education staff.

Photography

Photography and filming of any kind is strictly forbidden in any part of the Royal Courts of Justice complex, including outside courtyard areas.

Lunch facilities

Unfortunately there are no lunchroom facilities within the Royal Courts of Justice building. Groups are to make their own arrangements to have lunch. We recommend Lincoln Inn Fields Park (weather permitting) which is located behind the Royal Courts of Justice building.
