



Characters in Court

KS1

This two-hour workshop introduces children to the law and the role of the courts in a fun and tactile session. They explore the consequences of certain choices through an interactive courtroom workshop based on the popular fairy tale of Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

Students will:

- Explore the roles in a courtroom
- Be encouraged to think about what is right, what is wrong and the consequences of their choices
- Discuss and debate to reach a verdict and decide an appropriate sentence

Curriculum links: Citizenship, SMSC including British Values, PSHE and English including Spoken Language

Duration: Two hours

Location: Greater Manchester Police Museum

Days/times: Fridays – 10am to 12 noon or 1pm to 3pm

Cost: £7.50 per student – maximum of 60 students per visit

Courtroom Workshops

KS2

These thought-provoking courtroom workshops explore a contemporary or historical criminal case.

Students will:

- Explore the roles in a courtroom
- Prepare and enact a trial based on a real criminal case
- Discuss and debate real sentencing options
- Learn about the law and justice system and consequences of breaking the law
- Become more aware of their rights and responsibilities to become more active citizens

Crime and Punishment Day

KS2

Pupils discover what it was like to be on the wrong side of the law. They are encouraged to think about the consequences and the importance of honesty.

This is a full day session which begins by exploring the history of the police force through a guided tour of Greater Manchester Police Museum. Pupils find out what happened to suspects, exploring the charge office and touring the cells. Later, pupils bring a defendant to trial by acting out what happens in court in the 1895 Magistrates courtroom located in the Museum.

Choice of courtroom workshops

Contemporary: Cyberbullying or robbery

Historical: Victorian child or suffragettes

Curriculum links: History, PSHE, Citizenship, English and History

Duration: Five hours

Location: Greater Manchester Police Museum

Tour and Play

KS2/SEN/PRU

A two hour session comprising a one hour guided tour of the Greater Manchester Police Museum. Pupils have the opportunity to dress up as police officers, followed by an hour dressing up as characters in the courtroom where they re-enact a real trial.

Students will:

- Learn about the law and justice system
- Explore roles in a courtroom
- Be encouraged to think about what is right, what is wrong and the consequences of their choices
- Discuss and debate the case to reach a verdict before deciding an appropriate sentence

Trials to choose from include: Shoplifting, Victorian children, cyberbullying

Curriculum links: Citizenship, SMSC including British Values, PSHE and English including Spoken Language

Duration: Two hours

UNIVERSITY AND THE LAW

University and the Law is a two hour session, visiting the moot courtroom at either the University of Manchester or University of Bolton. It provides an important opportunity for pupils to engage with local higher education institutions and to start thinking about future career choices.

Futures in Law is a full day at the university moot courtroom where learners engage with law undergraduates/graduates and find out about the pathways to progression into a career in law. Pupils develop their skills by re-enacting a real trial, taking on the character roles in a courtroom.

Choice of courtroom workshops: Hate crime, cyberbullying, knife crime

Curriculum links: PSHE, Citizenship, English and History

Duration: Two hours (10am-12noon or 1pm-3pm)
Full day 10am – 3pm

Location: University of Manchester/Bolton

MOTION TO APPEAL

Students explore a contemporary appeal case.

They will:

- Learn about the law and justice system
- Be introduced to the process of appeal cases
- Explore the roles in a courtroom
- Prepare, discuss and debate decisions reached in appeal cases

Choose from appeal themes: gang violence, freedom of religion, diminished responsibility
